



About the Community:

PHS is part of South Washington County Schools. The district includes the communities of Cottage Grove,



St. Paul Park, Newport, Woodbury, Grey Cloud Island and Afton, encompassing an area of 84 square miles. The population of the district is approximately 94,000 people, including 18,200 students who attend district schools.

Approximately 18.4% of the student population at PHS participates in the Free/Reduced Lunch Program.

Curriculum Features

Park High School offers a comprehensive curriculum of over 170 courses, including a full range of college preparatory, general and career technical classes designed to meet the needs of all students.

International Baccalaureate Diploma Program:

Park High School is an International Baccalaureate (IB) World School, offering the internationally-recognized IB diploma program. This program aims to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect.

Students may elect to take a number of IB courses or pursue the full IB diploma. IB courses include English, History, Spanish, French, Math including two-year calculus, Chemistry, Biology, Physics, Sports Exercise/Health Sciences, Psychology and Visual Arts.

Grading and Ranking Procedures


GPA is based on marks earned in grades 9–12 and is calculated on a 4.0 point system. All courses for which the student receives a grade A–F are included in the GPA. Pass grades are not included in the GPA, but do count for credit (a maximum of two credits per year may be taken with the pass/no credit option).

Grades for AP and IB courses will receive a weighted grade using a 1.2 multiplier (i.e. A = 4.8). The highest GPA for the class of 2019 was a 4.42.

Advanced Placement Test Results


- In 2022, Park High School students took AP tests in 7 subject areas; over 229 exams were taken, 93 students scored a 3 or higher.
- Since 2017, 711 students have scored a 3 or higher on an AP exam.

Our SAT scores cannot be compared to the state and national average since fewer than 15% of PHS students take this exam.

IB Diploma Candidates

- The PHS IB program has a higher diploma attainment rate than the state and national average.
- Park High School has graduated more than 87 full IB candidates since the inception in 2009. In 2022, 100% of senior candidates received an IB diploma.
- In 2022, 166 students took 360 IB exams. Since 2009, 946 PHS students have scored a 5 or higher on an IB exam, earning college credits.
- 32 PHS students have earned a perfect score on IB exams.

 More than 81% of 2019 Park High School graduates will attend college in the fall of 2019.

Spotlights on PHS

- PHS includes a Wellness Center, Multicultural Inclusion Center and an Inventor Space.
- Park High School girls softball had back-to-back appearances at the State Tournament in 2016 and 2017.
- The Park High School Thunderbolts soccer and floor hockey teams were state tournament consolation champs in 2016.
- Park's 2017 One-Act Play was chosen to perform at the International Thespian Festival.
- PHS students are involved in more than 30 athletic teams and participated in more than 50 clubs and organizations including Animal Rights, ASL, Chamber Theater, Debate, GSA, Key Club, Link Crew, Math Team, NHS, Step Team, and Youth Teaching Youth.
- IB diploma candidates score higher on exams than the state and national average.
